## 1. Determine what research you're interested in

## 3. Contact Researchers About Research Assistance

Use our email template to email researchers and ask whether there are any research positions available. You may have to volunteer your time without pay (I had to volunteer for 2 years before getting paid). You also may have to email many labs before even getting a response. If you don't hear back from a lab, you can consider finding other lab members on the lab's website and contacting them directly.
